The organ, nearly completed, was commissioned and blessed by the Rev. Patrick Taylor, Vicar of Stratford-upon-Avon, in the presence of HRH Prince Charles on the 4th June 2014.

The official opening in October was marked by the Opening Recital. This was given by Stephen Dodsworth who played the programme twice in order to accommodate all those who wished to attend and had generously donated to the cost of building the organ, mainly through the Sponsor a Pipe Scheme.



The lovely case, part of the 1950s overall design for the Chapel by Stephen Dykes Bower, was left untouched (other than the re-gilding of display pipes) but nothing remained of the old organ other than the pedal Bourdon 16 and Open diapason 16.

Geoffrey Coffin and his marvellous team at Principal Pipe Organs, York, took the suggested design for the organ and built the splendid instrument which now graces the Chapel; an instrument built with posterity in mind, and an instrument that will always be worth, will always demand, to be maintained and preserved. The Swell Organ is placed above the Great Organ which enables the organ to speak well across the length of the building, and is enhanced by Geoffrey Coffin's voicing to the Chapel's lovely acoustic.

Since its completion there have been many occasions when the organ's flexibility and comprehensive design have supported superbly choral concerts and services, and each year since its inception there has been a recital series, each featuring four distinguished players.
